



## Multisensory Math Methods

**Course Overview:** In this 50-hour class, teachers and tutors will develop an understanding of how students learn mathematics and how to apply a multisensory approach to teaching mathematics. Participants will learn the essential elements of a successful multisensory instructional approach, how to administer and interpret diagnostic assessments in preparing individualized lesson plans, and all the necessary knowledge to prepare and deliver effective math instruction. Prerequisite for this course is a Bachelor's degree.
