The Orton-Gillingham approach is rooted in a century of neurological, psychological and educational research kept current through continual refinement.

# A Typical Day

## Morning Academics

- One-on-One Orton-Gillingham tutoring

- Workshops by Theater of Inclusion in conflict resolution, social skills, and goal setting
